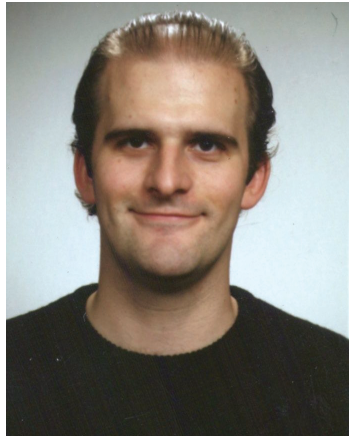

How to Apply

Jérôme Lohez 9/11 Scholarship Foundation applicants will be screened by the foundation’s executive board of internationally qualified professionals and academics. The deadline for applications is September 30 of each calendar year. Because of varying academic calendars, applicants are advised to apply immediately upon their acceptance to a specific dual-degree program. The board meets to review submissions in mid-October, and scholarship winners are announced in early November. The scholarship is granted in mid-December.

Eligibility

The Foundation provides scholarships to (i) American students accepted to a dual-degree program, undergraduate or graduate, who wish to study in France or China as part of the degree program, or (ii) French students accepted to a dual-degree program who wish to complete their course of study in the USA or China as part of the degree program, or (iii) Chinese students accepted to a dual-degree program who wish to complete their course of study in the USA or France as part of the degree program. The scholarship will be in an amount to be determined by the board of directors. All recipients are required to participate in the Foundation Ambassadors Program for one year.

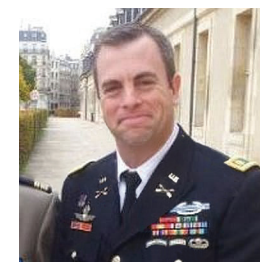
