The third guest on the show will be Eric A. Plumer, author of *The Da Vinci Code Phenomenon: Why Its Claims Struck a Chord*. Plumer investigates the contemporary events, ideas, and movements that fostered Dan Brown's unprecedented dominance of best-seller lists and dinner-table conversation.

The musical guest for the show this week will be piper Matt MacIsaac. Matt's very traditional piping CD aptly named *The Piping Album* is a strong selection of tunes that shows the range and the strengths of this Cape Breton piper. After years competing solo and with pipe bands Matt now enjoys the best of both piping worlds as a professional touring musician.

Tune in next week, May 9th, to the live show or podcast to hear Donald Ray Pollock, author of *Knockemstiff*.
